You do not need to do everything that's suggested in the sheets. Some of you will garden only with containers, and some of you will have large gardens on an acreage. I've tried to make the planner general enough so that it can be used in multiple gardening situations.

You can also skip all the seed starting pages if you've decided to buy starter plants instead, In fact, if this is your very first garden, I recommend skipping seed starting. Try it next year once your confidence has grown.

GRIDS: Use the grid that best fits the size of your garden or container and fill in the vegetables/flowers in each of the squares. For the larger one, remember to leave space to get around.

JOURNALS: Print out as many copies as you need. The weekly journal has a little spot for circling the weather each day.

CHECKLISTS: Not every item on the checklist will apply to your garden. Use what you need, and fill out the blank spaces with any other items.

DATE TRACKING: Keeping track of the dates you seed started, hardened off, planted, and harvested your crops helps you better plan for next year.
